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






Assessment 1 (15%) - Individual

- **Task**: Demonstrate an independent approach to the mastery of foundational research skills. In-class exercises require students to undertake practical activities to build skills in conducting literature reviews and developing research proposals.
- Length: In-class exercises vary in size each week according to the nature of the topic and type of activity. The exercises' scope ranges from short written responses (e.g., 100-200 words per Question) to complete structured worksheets (e.g., 250-500 words).
- **Due:** Week 2 to Week 12 (**Submission**: Tutorial activity sheet to be submitted to the Canvas Assessments folder shortly after weekly tutorial sessions and before the next tutorial day. If you have any difficulties, then please discuss issues with tutors.



Assessment 3 (40%) - Group

- Type: Group Report
- **Task:** Students will develop Group (up to 4) project proposals demonstrating that the student is engaging in genuine enquiry and investigating something worthwhile.
- This industry-style report will link the proposed research question and the literature review to existing knowledge, ideas, facts, technologies, and relevant solutions. It should be suitable and feasible for executing the student's capstone project in the subsequent session.
- The report must contain the following elements:
 - Cover Page, Abstract, Table of Contents, Executive Summary, Introduction, Research Aims and
 - -Objectives, Background, Research Significance and Innovation, Research Methods, Project plan and resources, Conclusion Reference List and Appendix.
- Length: 3000-5000 words not including the table of contents, reference list or appendix.
- Due: week 12, on Friday at 11:59 pm, 1 Nov
